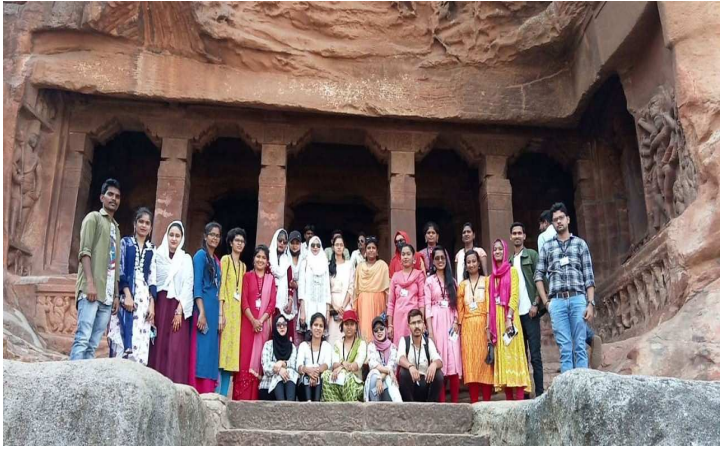


## SHAIKH COLLEGE OF EDUCATION ORGANIZED STUDY TRIP FOR HISTORY STUDENTS



Shaikh College of Education organized one day study tour on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2022 for B.Ed III sem students for the purpose of gaining knowledge about our cultural heritage and the dynasties ruled over Karnataka.

Students of Shaikh College of Education visited to Bagalkot district where Chalukya dynasty has ruled over 600 years. We visited to Badami caves it was built by Mangalesha (**598 – 610 AD**) brother of **Kiritavarman-I** completed the construction of the cave temples & endowed the temples with the village on the occasion of the installation of the image of Vishnu.

The **Durga temple** is an early 8th-century Hindu temple located in Aihole, Karnataka, India. Originally dedicated to Surya, it has the most embellished and largest relief panels in Aihole depicting artwork of Shaivism, Vaishnavism, Shaktism and Vedic deities.

The Pattadakallu Virupaksha temple was built by **Queen Loka Mahadevi**, wife of King Vikramaditya II after the successful military campaigns in Kancheepuram. The temple has a vast quadrangle surrounded by small cells or shrines. It has a massive gateway and a small gate behind.

The Mahakuta group of temples is located in Mahakuta, a village in the Bagalkot district of Karnataka state, India. It is an important place of worship for Hindus and the location of a well-known Shaiva monastery.

Bansankari temple Built in 1915 by Somanna Shetty, an ardent devotee of Goddess Banashankari (also referred to as Amma), Banashankari Temple is one of the most prominent places of worship in Bangalore. The idol of Amma installed in the temple was brought here by Somanna from Badami in Bijapur district
